Gun Violence Prevention and Reduction Grant Opportunities



Initiative Overview

In response to high levels of gun violence experienced since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, Cook County designated \$85 million to the Safe & Thriving Communities American Rescue Plan Act Initiative: The Violence Prevention and Reduction Grant Portfolio. An additional \$25 million of funding has been designated to the initiative through a partnership with the Illinois Department of Human Services Office of Firearm Violence Prevention, bringing the total investment to just over \$110 million.

The grant initiative, led by the Cook County Justice Advisory Council (JAC), was designed to fund a diverse array of service providers that support residents at high risk of experiencing gun violence as either a victim or perpetrator. The initiative prioritizes communities with the highest rates of shootings and gun-related homicides in Chicago and Suburban Cook County.

Applications for funding were open to 501(c)(3) and 501(c)(4) organizations that provide violence prevention programming in Cook County. Applicant organizations were asked to propose creative community-driven programming, leveraging at least one of the following evidence-informed violence prevention strategies: Prevention and Support Services, Street Outreach and Intervention, Case Management, Victim Services and Hospital Based Services.

Response & Selection Process

190 applications were submitted, representing nearly 400 unique organizations and a total request for funding of nearly \$500 million.

The highly selective review process consisted of review panels, utilizing a standardized rubric to evaluate applications in accordance with the point values articulated in the <u>application materials</u>.

The overwhelming response from qualified applicants signaled to the JAC the high volume of organizations ready to expand and deliver critical violence prevention programming in Cook County. The JAC subsequently explored and secured additional funding for high quality proposals that were received but not initially funded under the initiative.



Grant Awards

Grant Award Cycle 1: Following the application review period, an initial 34 grants were awarded totaling \$75 million in funding to be distributed over three years. 5 grant awards were approved by the Cook County Board in June 2022 and 29 were approved in July 2022. The 34 grants were awarded to individual organizations and coalitions that together represent 66 unique organizations.

Grant Award Cycle 2: In the winter of 2023, the JAC partnered with the Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS) Office of Firearm Violence Prevention to fund an additional group of highly ranked applicants under the initiative. In January 2023, Cook County was awarded \$25 million in funding from IDHS and the County Board approved 39 additional grants that support 70 unique organizations.

Grant Award Cycle 3: In the Spring of 2023, the JAC facilitated a third grant award cycle with the remaining Cook County ARPA funds allocated to the initiative. In this cycle, just over \$10 million in funding was awarded. The additional 17 grants support 22 unique organizations.

In total, the grant initiative represents just over \$110 million of investment in gun violence prevention and reduction services since 2022. There are currently 90 active grant awards that support 150 unique organizations providing services in Cook County communities that have been most impacted by gun violence.

Award Summary
