COOK COUNTY EQUITY INVESTMENT

Since taking office, President Preckwinkle has worked tirelessly to address decades of trauma and disinvestment by providing hundreds of millions of dollars in no cost healthcare and tens of millions of dollars to economic development and justice grants. This FY2021 budget is building on the administration's long record of addressing inequality by adding a commitment of close to \$100 million to be invested over the next two years.
